Moderate sentiment for booking new tonnages among green ship recyclers at Alang.

Even the prices for both local and imported ferrous scrap remain stable.

General Elections backed with summer holidays might affect the pace of business until end of

April by then we believe cash buyers will have sufficient inventory in hand to offer.

Neither any surgical come back nor auto-pilot buying behavior was witnessed in the first quarter

of 2019 in this region, but eventually in immediate future this is the only market that can

smoothly support sustainable green ship recycling of large tonnages within the sub-continent.





# ABOUT CHATTOGRAM, BANGLADESH



Over-stocking of inventory can be witnessed soon.

Currently all leading and major recycling yards at Chattogram are saturated with inventories,

Recyclers here offer attractive prices to cash buyers but on the other hand face limitations in

issuing L/Cs. It has been leading in numbers and tonnages since the start of 2019.


Import of foreign originated goods is steady but will slow down soon.

Ramadan Celebrations in Pakistan and Bangladesh backed with General Elections in India shall


have cultural, economical and political implications on the ship recycling community.
